PROJECT FEEDBACK:

- The newly altered Alzheimer Project appears to align well with Disease Prevention and Treatment. The project objectives clearly align with building the capacity of the local healthcare structure through training, and physiotherapy equipment for the prevention of further injury or disease is also a strong fit. I would recommend touching base with the RGO once the type of equipment to be purchased has been defined.
- Starting 1 July 2018, all humanitarian and vocational training projects must conduct a
 community assessment. The community assessment can be conducted by host or
 international Rotarians, cooperating organizations or governments, but should involve
 talking directly with stakeholders in the beneficiary community. Tips for conducting
 community assessments can be found in the Rotary Community Assessment Tools
 document. The Community Assessment Results Form can also be included with the
 global grant application in order to transfer information about the assessment to The
 Foundation.
- Written confirmation from the Ministry of Health, or cooperating organization, must be provided stating all project activities follow accepted policies and clinical protocols of the government health care system.
